## Half a billion euros in public procurement: The success story behind Paradigm's eCatalogue

*Brussels, 8 June 2026 – The eCatalogue, the purchasing platform developed and managed by Paradigm, has passed the 500 million euro mark in cumulative purchases since it went live in 2009. A symbolic step that confirms the key role it plays in IT purchasing for Brussels' public institutions.*

Used by the Brussels authorities and several other public institutions, the eCatalogue simplifies procurement procedures for public IT contracts, while enabling contracting authorities to benefit from the advantages of grouping orders.

After fifteen years of continuous growth, the eCatalogue now boasts over 2,000 registered users, more than 340 active institutional clients and almost 100 suppliers.

### Heading for a record year in 2026

Last year, the platform handled almost 70 million euros worth of orders. Since its launch, the eCatalogue has seen average annual growth of 20%.

The momentum continues into 2026: As of 1 June, over 54 million euros of expenditure had already been registered in the eCatalogue.

### About the eCatalogue

The eCatalogue is Paradigm's regional platform for managing the execution of public IT contracts. Set up in 2009, it centralises the purchases of hardware, software and IT services carried out under public procurement contracts awarded by the Purchasing Group.

Today, the platform offers over 5,000 products and more than 3,000 configuration and expansion options. It covers 16 public procurement contracts spread over more than 50 lots, and ensures a high level of security thanks to authentication via CSAM and IAM.

The eCatalogue integrates client- and supplier-focused features, as well as control mechanisms to ensure compliance with contractual frameworks and track expenditure by contract and lot.
